

DATES:

Monday-Friday, March 12-16

LOCATION:

We will be based at the Liturgia Rural Worker's Education Center in Lyons, NY (about 45 min east of Rochester and 20 min south of Lake Ontario.) During the week we will also travel around Wayne County to visit farms and meet with other individuals and groups.

LODGING:

We will spend the week "community style," in the Center, which is an old Victorian house. We will share rooms and cook together and share the common spaces.

FEES:

The cost of the five day program is \$350. ***A deposit of \$50 is due by the registration deadline of February 28th.*** This fee covers the cost of room and board over the course of the week, the program, as well as transportation and administrative costs during the week.

During the week, you will have the opportunity to travel throughout the western part of New York State as part of a program that incorporates experiential education with lectures and in depth reflection on issues that impact farmworkers.

The program offers an in-depth look at the many facets of farmworker life, while participants learn more about the agribusiness system and the labor protections from which farmworkers are excluded. You will meet and engage in conversation with both farmworkers and advocates.

During the week we will look at different efforts to correct the unjust policies that impact farmworkers.



The theme for the week will be **The Meaning of Social Justice**

We will examine the question, “How do individuals and groups affect social change?”

We will reflect on the difference between service and social justice and how it feels to be involved in a long-term struggle for systematic change.

Speakers will include farmworkers, an immigration expert, community organizers, RMM staff and others. At the end of the week we will gather and plan different actions that we can engage in on behalf of justice for farmworkers.
